

### > INSTALLING THE BATTERIES

1. Remove the battery cover.




#### > CONNECT THE USB NANO RECEIVER

1. Switch on your computer.

2. Slide the power switch of the keyboard to the **ON** position.

3. Insert the RF receiver into a free USB slot.

4. The keyboard should connect automatically.



#### > ACTIVATING THE KEYBOARD

If the keyboard does not respond, perform the following:

1. Remove the RF receiver.


2. Turn over the keyboard without pressing any key. Check the power switch is in the **ON** position. 3. Re-insert the RF receiver into the USB slot.



4. Then press any key. The keyboard should now be activated and ready for use.

## > FUNCTION KEYS

To use these function keys, ensure that **numlock** is off. Then first press and hold the **fn** button then the desired key.



0	Media	Starts the media player.
2	Volume Down	Decreases audio volume.
3	Volume Up	Increases audio volume.
4	Mute	Turns off the audio output.
6	Prev	Goes to previous track.
6	Next	Goes to next track.
0	Play / Pause	Play / Pauses media content.
8	Stop	Stops playing media content.
9	Homepage	Opens your default web browser to the web page set to display on opening.
10	E-mail	Lauches the default e-mail application.
1	My Computer	Opens a new window for "My Computer".
12	My Favorite	Opens the browser's favourites folder or bookmarks folder.

## > HINTS AND TIPS

#### Number pad:

To access the embedded number pad, press numlock. To return to the full normal keyboard, press numlock again.

#### Kevboard not working:

- 1. Have the batteries been inserted incorrectly or are they spent?
- Check the polarity (+/-) or exchange them for new ones as necessary.
- 2. Make sure the USB Receiver is plugged into a USB port and the computer is on.
- 3. Remove metallic objects between the keyboard and the USB Nano receiver.
- 4. If the Nano receiver is plugged into a USB hub, try plugging it directly into the computer's USB port.
- 5. Move the keyboard closer to the receiver.
- 6. Turn off the keyboard and remove the USB receiver. Plug in the USB receiver and turn the keyboardback on, press and hold the Connect button.

7. Restart the computer.

## > SAFETY WARNINGS

- Don't disassemble the keyboard or remove any parts.
- Don't immerse the keyboard in water or any liquid.
- Don't use the keyboard close to heat sources or expose to high temperatures.
- Don't use the keyboard where strong electromagnetic waves are present. Strong electromagnetic waves will cause damage to the keyboard.
